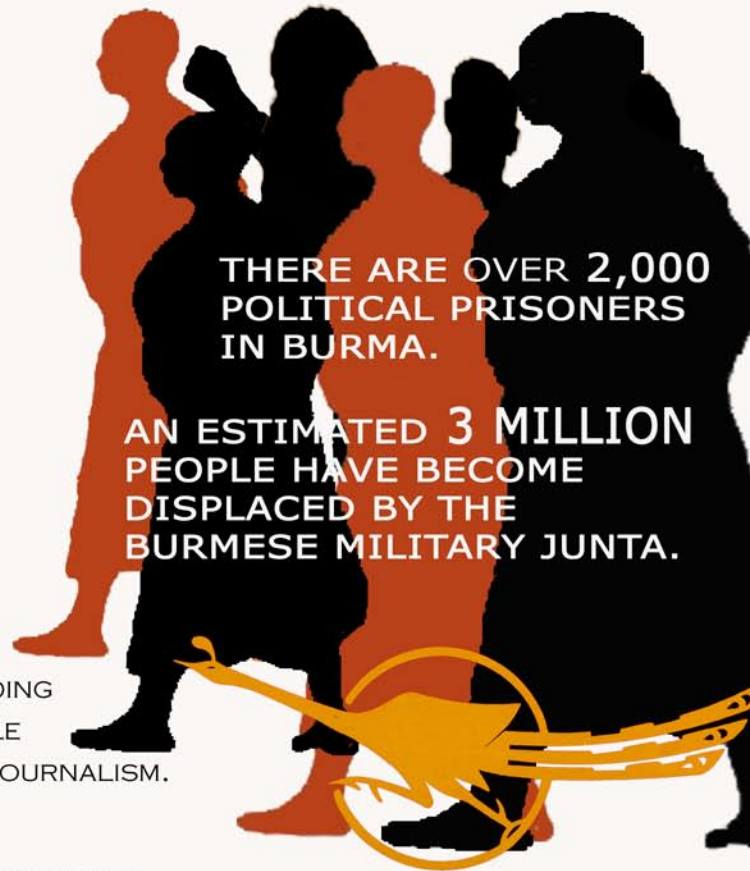

ZOYA PHAN

AT 14, ZOYA BECAME A REFUGEE AFTER ESCAPING A MILITARY ATTACK ON HER KAREN VILLAGE. SHE IS CURRENTLY THE INTERNATIONAL COORDINATOR OF BURMA CAMPAIGN UK AND HAS MET WITH POLITICAL LEADERS AND GOVERNMENTS AROUND THE GLOBE TO ADVOCATE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS IN BURMA.
